### **Parish Council Update**

Season's greetings you lovely lot! I hope you're all well?

We're here again with the anticipation of all things festive resting heavily on all our hearts and minds I'm sure. If you need someone to talk to, there are people here for you! I will do my best to update the website (see below) with numbers for you to access help on a whole host of subjects. If you can't find what you're looking for, please let me know, I will try to find it for you.

If you'd like a friendly face to talk to, the 'Warm in Wedmore' initiative opens its door again from the 6 December at the Masonic Hall between 10 am and 2 pm. There's always a really lovely atmosphere there!

OK, so Parish Council update, that's what you're here for right? Well, firstly - and you'll never believe it - when I say I've got another new Councillor! A huge Wedmore welcome to Phillip Weale, (I knew my constant badgering would eventually pay off!). We're up to 12 now, but Blackford would benefit from a couple more representatives, so don't worry if you live there and thought you had missed the boat, you haven't... Get your application in quickly though, I don't want you to miss out.

Secondly, the budget will be formally agreed this month, ready to submit to Somerset Council in January. The members have ensured that we continue to provide you with the desired service, whilst balancing the environmental and financial pressures right now.

Thirdly, Jacky and I attended the second LCN (Local Community Network) meeting at the end of October. There was lots of talk about priorities, and this is where I need your help. Somerset Council are expecting us to work collaboratively within our LCN to deliver schemes that benefit our community directly. In order to do this, we need to identify a common concern across the towns, villages and hamlets, and work out how we can successfully design, implement and sustain a resolution to whatever this concern is. Whether its Transport, Planning, Environmental Issues etc, over the coming weeks I will be gathering information to share with you all about how this is supposed to work and what we can do on an individual and wider level to get the best results. I'd really appreciate if you would take some time to engage with me about it, however you feel most comfortable, via letter, email, telephone, or the website. We are actually really lucky to have a strong and supportive group of neighbours that form our LCN, we have the chance to effect real change to our communities, we just need to hear your voices!


Also, a quick reminder, the minutes for all of the Parish Council meetings, as well as various committee meetings, are all available on the website www.wedmore-pc.gov.uk

### Wedmore Real Ale Festival Donations

Wedmore Real Ale Festival (WRAF) celebrated another successful year of ale drinking and fundraising, with the organisers pouring out £18,000 in donations to local worthy causes. Some 19 organisations were handed cheques at the annual Presentation Evening in the function room of The Post & Wicket on 21 October 2023. The



cheques were presented to a room full of successful beneficiaries, Ale Festival Committee members and volunteers, who gathered to celebrate a very successful 22nd festival, which took place in the village over the weekend of 15-17 September.

This year's £18,000 of donations brings the overall total amount of money they have raised for local worthy causes over the festival's 22-year history to a whopping £264,820.

'As with all previous years, we're delighted that this year's festival was a great success. We're very proud to be able to give away £18,000 this year, considering the significant increase in costs associated with putting on the festival', said James Turbitt, WRAF's Chairperson.

James added: 'It's never easy deciding on where and how much to donate with so many worthy causes in need of funds, but we try to spread what we have to give across as many beneficiaries as we can. It is always a highlight for the committee to be giving out the cheques and it makes all the hard work in putting on and running the festival more than worthwhile. As always, none of this would not be possible without the huge commitment from our committee, the team of volunteers, our sponsors and everyone else who supports the festival in one way or another. So, they should also take the credit for what we have all achieved again this year'.

### **Green Wedmore Solar Challenge 1000**

Green Wedmore launched the Solar Challenge 1000 campaign at the start of 2021. The ambition is for Wedmore to have 1000 solar roofs by 2030, about 60% of the parish.

Since that time the scheme has installed 80 roofs which, combined with pre-2021 installations, brings our village total to 260, or 16% of homes enjoying far lower electricity bills. As best we can tell this total is more than the combined installations of all other similar 'solar street' type schemes in the whole of Somerset which is a phenomenal success.

But we still have a long way to go.

This campaign is a perfect example of the benefits of leading a lower carbon lifestyle. As a customer you see lower bills and a payback on the installation costs of about 7 years.





Wedmore Opera presented sell-out performances of the ever popular The Marriage of Figaro at the Village Hall on 11, 13, and 14 October. The set was cleverly devised so several different scenes in and around the hotel could be portrayed with a bare minimum of time wasting and

Purists might have been disappointed to hear the original libretto translated from the Italian, but the English translation provided many opportunities for amused tittering from the audience and on occasion some outright guffawing! It was cleverly done by Kenneth Jakobs and Douglas Nairne and, considering the Figaro arias are so well-known in Italian, the translation did not sound awkward or lose musical line as a consequence.

The cast of ten soloists was simply superb, the vocal quality of all the soloists was truly first class. The young leads were outstanding with Matthew Tilley's velvety baritone and assured, confident performance as Figaro, and Ellen Steward, at just twenty years old, was delightfully convincing as ingénue Susanna.

Mention must be made of the redoubtable Megan Strachan who saved the day by stepping in at short notice to play the Countess Almaviva in two of the three performances. Although it was a role with which she was familiar, she had never sung this translation. No-one in the audience could ever have guessed she only joined the cast for their dress rehearsal – what a star!

The role of Count Almaviva was in the safe hands of Dominic Bowe, demonstrating his obvious experience and command of the operatic genre. Merryn Gamba as Marcellina, and young Alex Pinkstone as Don Basilio, entertained with their accomplished comedic acting, raising laughter from the audience every time they appeared on stage. Megan Strachan, Noémie Johns as Cherubino, and Anthony Stuart Lloyd as Dr. Bartolo impressed and thrilled us with their vocal agility and sumptuous sound.

The modern setting and the young soloists gave the performance a freshness that, together with the English translation, managed to unravel what is a manically implausible and convoluted plot!

The small orchestra of just eleven musicians was in effect an orchestra of soloists. Nevertheless, the tone produced was extraordinary in quality and volume. A much larger ensemble could not have done better. From the opening bars of the Overture the success of the reduced orchestration, written by Jonathan Lyness of Opera Orchestrations, was wholly apparent to a grateful audience, appreciative of the respect shown to the original writing. The ensemble playing was tight with economical direction from Carolyn Doorbar.

How extraordinary that we can enjoy an operatic production like this to a professional standard in a village hall! The whole cast, the production team, the orchestra and director deserve our heartfelt congratulations and thanks for giving us a memorable and magical evening. We are indeed very lucky to have Wedmore Opera!

# Regular Features

### This Month in the Garden by Tony Connell

Gardens mostly snooze in December but there are some plants that contribute both colour and scent. Viburnum x bodnantense, Chimonanthus, Daphne bholua, Lonicera fragrantissima, Camellia praecox, and Mahonia to name but a few. Had you noticed that most winter flowering plants are beautifully scented and long in flower? This is nature's way of giving them the best chance of being pollinated or to feed the scarcer birds, insects and bees.

Some of our uncut hedgerows also colour the lanes to reward our winter walks. There may still be scarlet rose hips, black privet berries, sycamore seeds, gold and tan hazel leaves, glowing holly leaves and flowering ivy and, if you're lucky, a glowing scarlet bramble leaf.

On a fine day, it is not too late to plant tulip bulbs and many bargains can be found in nursery or garden centres at this end of season. For the forward thinkers, do check on any pots of forced hyacinths and daffodils and water them as needed. About 6 weeks of darkness suit bulbs best as they need to grow strong roots before the shoots are forced up out of their winter rest. But if you didn't get round to this earlier, don't panic, your local nursery will have lots of potted bulbs all ready to burst into flower inside.

Back in the garden, a bit of pruning can be done, cutting back by half the shoots of bush roses and buddleias to help avoid wind rocking. Pyracanthas have been wonderful



this autumn, laden with orange berries, but don't forget that there are also red and yellow varieties available. Trim back any lavender bushes you missed last autumn but don't cut back into the old wood as they will not regrow from that. Garden shredders can be wonderful for converting all manner of prunings into carbon rich mulch to add to the compost heap, but they can be a noise nuisance to neighbours, so be considerate. As you know the best compost is made from a mixture of (roughly) two thirds green waste to one of woody waste but for small gardens the council's green bins are probably best for disposing of garden waste.

Down on the allotment or vegetable area (and raised beds are an excellent way to grow vegetables) winter digging is becoming outdated. However, on new plots or those on heavy ground I like to single dig the soil. The secret is to open up a trench and then dig forward to create a new trench and then continue. Raised beds rarely need this as the soil should be of good structure. The trouble with digging is that it gives all the natural organisms a headache as they have to fight their way back to their appropriate place in the soil profile. Digging is not generally in fashion, and I do like the 'no digging' system, but it comes down to a matter of choice - remember the Victorians and the war time growers who obtained excellent vegetable crops by digging. The best digging spade I ever had was made by Wolf. All you had to do was push the blade down into the soil and lean back. The blade was sprung and it flicked the lump of soil forward into the open trench. So, both dig and no-dig systems have their supporters with appropriate exercise also being a factor.

This is a good time to buy your 'seed' potatoes and stand them, eyes uppermost, in trays or egg boxes. Keep them in the light but frost free until the shoots are growing and the potatoes are ready for planting from March onwards. This really gets them off to a good start and productive harvest. In mild weather, shallots and onion sets can be planted from now on or started off in pots and trays under cover for planting out later in spring. A very happy Christmas to you and all your plants!



# Tasty Morsels – Recipes for You Hoisin Glazed Pork Belly

Ingredients

800g pork belly slices (about 8-10 slices)

Salt

60ml hoisin sauce (1/4 cup)

2 tbsp soy sauce

2 tbsp runny honey

1 garlic clove minced (or 1 tbsp garlic paste)

25ml water

### Method

Pre-heat your oven to 230°C. Place the pork belly slices on a lined baking tray, skinside up and at least a finger's width apart. Salt the skin side of the pork and place in the oven for 20 minutes. Reduce the oven temperature to 180C and roast for another 40 minutes.

Meanwhile, make the hoisin glaze by mixing the remaining ingredients in a small saucepan. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer for 5 minutes stirring occasionally.

When the pork belly has 20 minutes left to roast, spoon the glaze over the pork belly slices making sure the sides get some glaze as well. Serve 2-3 slices per person with rice and some vegetables.

low mobility and people living in deprived circumstances. But for all of us there are some strategies which the Government recommends, for example, try to heat rooms you spend a lot of time in (living room or bedroom) to at least 18°C, try to reduce draughts, keep your bedroom windows closed at night, wear several layers of thinner clothing (rather than one thicker layer). 

### Isle of Wedmore Society

The Membership heard a most interesting talk by Helen Emmings at the meeting on 26 October, entitled 'Women at the Margins - working with women facing adversity and trauma.' She gave an overview and reflections that included her own experiences.



Having developed an academic interest in social policy and criminal justice during her degree and Masters at Swansea University, Helen qualified as a Probation Officer

in Avon and Somerset 16 years ago. This began a career that has woven its way through the criminal justice system, into the voluntary sector and which sparked a passionate interest in the challenges faced specifically by women. With roles on the front line in women's services and moving into campaigning and strategic work, she has seen and heard the stories of women who have been impacted by the criminal justice system. She has also witnessed where women have been failed but then celebrated their triumphs. The case histories of two women illustrated those she had aimed to help.

Helen gave us some rather startling, if not depressing statistics. Perhaps surprisingly though only 4% of those in prison are women and the main reason for their prison sentences are non-payment of TV licences. We also learnt that it costs £52,000 per year to maintain a woman in prison, a figure considerably higher than that for men. However, 58% of women re-offend within a year of leaving prison.

We also heard about the Somerset Women's Centre, opened in 2019, that exists to help women in prison and that now employs 22 people – all women. The Somerset Women's Centre provides help, support, guidance and advice. Further information is available at www.nelsontrust.com/what-we-do/our-services/

### Air France Disasters in 1950 by Kevin Patience

This time his talk concerned the crashes of two Air France DC-4 aircraft coincidentally within two days of each other. Both were bound for Paris from Saigon in Indo China. The first DC-4 aircraft Delta Echo crashed into the sea on 12 June 1950 on the approach to Bahrain airport and lay in twenty feet of water. Forty-six passengers were killed but five survived including the pilot Jan Sladek. The Air Accident Investigation Board and French authorities carried out a detailed analysis of the circumstances and concluded pilot error.

The second Air France DC-4 Delta Mike crashed two days later on the same approach to Bahrain airport in virtually identical circumstances, but this time in deeper water. In total eighty-six died in the two crashes. Kevin, a man of many parts, is also a commercial diver and explained how difficult it was to recover the bodies at the time. The number of casualties further complicated the situation as there were insufficient coffins available in Bahrain so help was provided by manufacturers in Karachi, Pakistan. The casualties were buried in the English cemetery in Bahrain before being exhumed three years later and returned to France.

Some forty years later Kevin, rediscovered the wreckage of Delta Mike's wing and engines and having had the cemetery cleaned and tidied organised the recovery of a propeller, which was erected to commemorate the victims that died in the two crashes. A dedication service was held attended by the French Ambassador to Bahrain

who later presented Kevin with the French National Order of Merit, as a token of thanks from France.

It transpired some time later, after some excellent detective work by Kevin and his brother, that the most likely cause of the two tragic crashes was wind shear, a massive down draft and a phenomenon unknown at the time. A desert sand storm can produce powerful cross winds and a severe downdraft and an aircraft approaching the runway to land would have little chance of recovery in these circumstances. So Jan Sladek and the other pilot were not to blame after all.

Kevin ended his talk with some salutary advice: if you are flying ALWAYS wear your seat belt. A sudden downdraft known as clear air turbulence could find you hitting the roof of the aircraft and incurring severe injuries.

### Becoming a Local Author by Damien Boyd

On Wednesday 25 October Wedmore Probus was visited by Damien Boyd, who gave a talk entitled 'Becoming a Local Author'. Damien opened an entertaining session with a short reading from his second novel - Head in the Sand - which features Wedmore. He went on to tell of his journey from solicitor to crime author and how he started out self-publishing his novels.

Damien's family were bombed out of Bristol during the Second World War, moving to Burnham-on-Sea. Educated at St Dunstan's School, and King's College, Taunton, it seemed the obvious choice for Damien to set his crime series in his home county, with his fictional detective, Nick Dixon, living in Brent Knoll and working at the Bridgwater Police Centre. Damien's debut novel, As the Crow Flies, was released in April 2013 becoming an international Kindle #1 bestseller. Translated into several languages, the series has since gone on to sell nearly four million copies. Showcasing the best of Somerset, the novels follow Nick Dixon as he races around the county; Cheddar Gorge, Berrow Beach, Taunton Racecourse, the Quantocks, Exmoor, the flooded Somerset Levels, Mendip caves and the abandoned Somerset Coal Canal are just some of the geographical locations featured.

Damien spoke about where the inspiration for each of his novels came from and the often tiny events that can provide the spark for an entire plot. He also touched on the publishing process and, during a question and answer session, the minefield that is television. Much enjoyed and possibly inspired some of us to start writing.



### **October Shouts**

In October there were 15 'Shouts' between our four Lifeboat Stations (Burnham-on-Sea – 4, Minehead – 3, Portishead – 3, Weston-super-Mare – 5).

At 17.40 on Monday 30 October, the Coastguard paged a request to launch both Weston lifeboats to assist Burnham Lifeboat team (that had already launched both their lifeboats) in a search for a missing male adult near Burnham Pier. Both lifeboats joined Burnham's two lifeboats as well as two rescue helicopters. The Atlantic crew were at sea for a staggering 7 hours and on the smaller D-class the crews were swapped at Burnham-on-Sea mid-way through the operation.

An extensive search was undertaken of the shoreline, estuaries of the River Brue and Parret and surrounding riverbanks, but nothing was found. This was a great example of a multi-agency operation involving two of our lifeboat stations, four of our lifeboats, several crews, the Maritime & Coastguard Agency Shore Team and two of their helicopters.

After mooring the Atlantic B class, the Weston crew returned to station at 00.30 with the D class rehoused and readied again for service by 01.45.


