

- isn't a big commitment. Many volunteers are only available occasionally, but they still make a valuable contribution. Even the volunteers who drive most frequently rarely drive more than once a month and they only drive at times when they make themselves available.
- is very rewarding as it provides an important service to many local residents.
- is great fun as the bus is a friendly place where there is normally a happy buzz of conversation and plenty of laughs.
- isn't difficult. All drivers are given free training by an approved Somerset CC trainer. This is provided before the volunteer starts driving and is repeated every 4 years.

Volunteers do need to have category D1 on their driving licence, but this should be available on all licences gained before September 2008. They will also need to undergo a DBS check (Disclosure and Barring Service) which we will arrange at no cost to the volunteer.



Tasty Morsels – Recipes for You

Sea Bream with Lemon Butter Caper Sauce

Ingredients – Sauce – 30g butter 3 tbsp capers in salt water/brine Juice of 1 large lemon Sea Bream – 2 fillets of sea bream Pinch of salt and pepper 2 tbsp plain flour 1 tbsp olive oil or vegetable oil

Method -

Melt the butter in a small saucepan, then add the capers and lemon juice. When adding the capers do not drain them, just spoon them directly in. Let simmer on medium-low heat as you prepare the fish.

Heat a frying pan over medium-high heat. Add the olive or vegetable oil. Season both sides of the fish with salt and pepper then lightly dust each side with the flour. Place the fish skin side down in the pan and cook for 2 minutes. The skin should be brown and crispy. If not, turn the heat in the pan to high and cook for an additional minute. Turn the fish over and cook skin side up for an additional 1 to 2 minutes depending on the thickness.

To serve, plate the fish crispy skin side up and spoon the sauce around the fish. If you drizzle directly on top, it will make the skin soggy. Best served with carrot and swede mash and some green beans. Enjoy S

This Month in The Garden

Wow what a month! With sunrise around 5.00 am and 16 hours of daylight, there's no excuse for excuses! And there's also two Bank Holidays. Lots of little birds are about this month, so supply water and feed to help them (they'll also help you by eating those pesky aphids). Make sure to grow poached egg plants (limnanthes) around any plants with green or blackfly problems – these flower early and attract lots of hoverflies which lay eggs the young of which eat your greenflies! Ants are not really a problem (in the garden) but they do encourage aphids so if you see ants on your plants, look again for aphids.

Remove faded flowers on bulbs and trim back aubretia. There's plenty of seeds still to sow, including the double daisy (bellis) and sweet william. These need plenty of time before flowering in spring 2025. Any spare ground (dry, infertile soil is ideal) can be used to sow some cornfield annuals like red poppies, blue cornflowers, white daisies, and yellow marigolds. These annuals are wonderful for attracting bees and other natural insects. Any single flowered plants will do this, and they don't have to be native to Britain. Last summer I watched my New Zealand flax flowers attracting loads of bees and I'm sure they had not travelled from New Zealand!

Four-inch cuttings can still be taken of geraniums, fuchsias and argyranthemum. They root quickly and fill any spare place in pots and tubs once rooted and planted out next month. Late flowering border plants (eg. phlox, achilleas, rudbeckia, sedums) could be cut halfway back now (the 'Chelsea Chop') to produce sturdier and more flower stems.

In the vegetable garden continue to sow beetroot, carrots, salad onions, peas and french beans, including the climbing version. I used to grow purple (also yellow) podded beans as they were easier to spot for harvest later in summer. French beans always seemed to start cropping earlier than runner beans and pollination was better. Also suitable for sowing now are courgettes (2 plants should be ample) and pumpkins. Weather can be unpredictable this month so be prepared to cover the early sowings out on the plot. Harden off tomatoes if growing outside. Sow mini cucumbers for the greenhouse - these are far better than the long types, much of which is often wasted, but the minis are more prolific and really delicious.

'No-mow May' is the lawn advice for this month and encourages some early wildflowers to feed the bees etc. Perhaps you could leave a section of lawn to develop as a meadow and leave until September for the next cut? No feed should be needed unless specific areas are getting worn down but, as you know, grass does grow well here in the West Country and rarely needs lawn feed. If you ever need to use weedkillers, try to do this in the evening after the 'goody' bees have gone to bed! If growing lilies, inspect regularly and squish any bright red lily beetles and larvae off the underside of the leaves.

This month is the start of the show season (Malvern and Chelsea) so treat yourself to a visit and gain some new ideas and inspiration. Also well worth a visit is our local Wedmore Village Farm in Plud Street. I went last month, and it really is a wonderful project, very much worth your interest and much needed donations. The Village Farm is very much in the early phase, but already there are lots of raised beds and donated plants (particularly fruit) and donated greenhouses. The site will be used to train children in growing and conservation as well as supplying the village shops in future. As a local priest, this struck me as an early and encouraging demonstration of the 'Kingdom of Heaven'. The site is totally organic and environmentally friendly with all wildlife encouraged and catered for. I cannot thank enough all the volunteers (e.g. Men's Shed) and folk who have had this vision and are working to create such a marvellous resource for the village (lots of information online). Do give this all the help and support that you can. Amen!

Thought for the Month

Of all the programmes on television, the ones that I enjoy most are those that feature wildlife – especially those narrated by Sir David Attenborough. The sheer beauty of God's creation and the complexity of animals and plants never fails to amaze me. How did it all happen? Genesis, the first book in the bible, contains wonderful symbolic stories about the creation of our world and all life that is on it.

We have come a long way in our understanding of the origin of our world since the 17th century when the Archbishop James Ussher calculated that the earth was created on 23 October, 6028 years ago. We now know that the earth took billions of years to form and for life to begin. The dinosaurs for example existed for 180 million years before becoming extinct 66 million years ago due to a massive asteroid impact.



We all look forward to the summer for some warmth and the longer days. For some this means sniffles and sneezes, if you one of the people who has hay fever then you will have mixed feelings about the approach of summer. It seems there is no easy answer to the

tiresome symptoms of sneezing, coughing, runny nose etc, however there is some helpful advice on the NHS website in their section on hay fever. Also, Allergy UK has some tips on their website, for example:-

Monitor pollen forecasts daily and stay indoors wherever possible when the count is high (generally on warmer, dry days). Rain washes pollen from the air so counts should be lower on cooler, wet days.

On high pollen days, shower and wash your hair after arriving home and change your clothing.

Avoid drying washing on a clothes-line outside when pollen counts are high.

Apply an effective allergen barrier balm around the edge of each nostril to trap or block pollens, and other allergens, to help prevent a reaction.

The Met Office can keep you informed about what the pollen count is, so you can plan your day accordingly – go to their website or download the app. So, we hope our start to summer will be a pleasure for everyone!

and society meetings. Having said that, it's hard for us to give someone a regular lift to something like a weekly class - we totally rely on volunteers and unfortunately can't guarantee that one will offer this kind of continuous and frequent support.

Other ways we can help include doing light chores around the house or garden, walking your dog if you're incapacitated and running errands to the chemist or post office. Volunteers can also help with writing letters and filling forms, including assisting with simple tasks that need completing online. The group can handle a wide variety of requests - but occasionally has to decline simply because the insurance policy does not cover every circumstance.

It's free to use but the group does have running costs insurance, petrol expenses, as well as vetting and training of volunteers (all volunteers are DBS checked and many have received first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation training). Club Reports and Society Updates

Isle of Wedmore Society

Report of 28 March Meeting

A most interesting talk by Jennifer Moorcroft, a dentist at our Surgery here in Wedmore and where she has looked after our

teeth for the last 5 years. Her subject was 'Dentistry: what your check-up reveals about you.' She told us how examining one's teeth can a give clues to one's lifestyle and illustrated her talk with a series of (rather gruesome) photos of various patient's teeth that were, to say the least, no longer in perfect condition. This even included those of a four-year-old child!

She explained how teeth examination gave various clues that could reveal one's life. One was under the heading of General Health and that included an alarming list of problem causes (gum disease, burning mouth, thrush, ulceration, pigmentation, blisters, dry mouth, bruxism, cognitive decline). Clues could also be revealed about a patient's past and present medication, as well as general health problems.

There was also an 'Ask the Audience' session, where we were shown pictures of various unhealthy teeth problems and invited to suggest the causes. There were some pretty wide-and-wild guesses.

Jennifer concluded by showing us a rather ancient skull (not that of Richard III!), perhaps 100 years old, and illustrated how the remaining skull's teeth could reveal that person's life style. Worn down jagged teeth probably not helped in food 'in days of old' being probably contaminated by sand, grit and dirt. Quite unlike the 'pure refined' food of today.

Next Meeting – Thursday 23 May

A talk by Philip Butterworth: 'A home through time.' Philip will give an account of his home, from the first fire in the grate around 1750, to the present day. He will link its story to local and national history, which may have affected it during its lifetime.

As usual, the meeting will be in the Wedmore Masonic Hall at 7.30 pm. Society members free, visitors £5 with free tea/coffee afterwards.

A Magistrate to the Rescue!



When March's guest speaker was unable to join us due to unavoidable circumstances, the evening was saved at short notice by Magistrate Marilyn Darg. Marilyn has been a Justice of the Peace for 26 years and gave us a very informative talk about the criminal justice system and about Life on the Bench. Marilyn had been due to speak to us later in the year.

Marilyn sits on the County Court's Bench at St. Georges, Worle, Weston-super-Mare. Magistrates are selected from the local community. Magistrates must not have a criminal record, must be good readers and listeners, and must be sensible! All magistrates have extensive initial training and continuing training. Three magistrates complete a bench, meaning a majority decision can always be achieved.

There are different categories of courts: Adult (for ages 18+); Youth (ages 10 to 18); and Family Courts (dealing in Public Law and Private Law). All cases begin in

a Magistrates Court. After an initial hearing in the Magistrates Court, serious cases, such as murder, are immediately passed on to a Crown Court.

When someone is arrested, they are taken to a police station, an investigation takes place, and the person is bailed or kept in custody. The Crown Prosecution Service decides on a charge; if charged, the person can be bailed to come to court. Failure to attend court is an additional charge. The trial is to establish the facts; CCTV technology, with its clear images, often helps determine the sequence of events and who was involved.

Magistrates when sentencing people must follow the National Sentencing Guidelines. A person can be given an absolute discharge; a conditional discharge (no action taken now, but action will be taken for both offences if you break the law again); or a fine. Fines must consider a person's income and are based on three bands. If you do not pay the fine, bailiffs can confiscate property and the court can get access to all your financial affairs.

The Magistrates Court coordinates with the Probation Service on rehabilitation in the local community. Magistrates are volunteers and are required to attend 26 half-day sittings each year, although Marilyn often attends more. Volunteers can be appointed from age 18 and volunteers from all sections of the local community are encouraged to apply. Do consider volunteering; it is easy to apply online via the Government website.

On a lighter note, one man's partner shouted, 'Who's going to take me shopping, who's going to take me to have my hair done?', when he lost his driving licence for a year after being convicted of drink driving. Marilyn said the Bench felt sorry for him, as a worse punishment probably awaited him at home!



March Shouts

In March there were 11 'Shouts' between our four Lifeboat Stations (Burnham-on-Sea - 1, Minehead - 1, Portishead - 5, Weston-super-Mare - 4).

On the evening of Monday 16 March, Milford Haven Coastguard tasked Westonsuper-Mare lifeboat to launch, to reports of a fisherman in the water near Birnbeck pier.

On approaching the site an update was received that the casualty was clinging to rocks just above the water. Weston-Super-Mare Coastguard Rescue Team were able to use torches to highlight the exact location of the casualty and two boat crew were put ashore where they were able to get to the casualty and move him to the lifeboat. At this point the male lost consciousness and was given emergency first aid in the boat as it returned to the slipway at speed.

Due to a high-water tide, the Helm was able to bring the boat to the top of the slipway where the casualty was attended to by the RNLI doctor before the ambulance and paramedics arrived and took over. The casualty regained consciousness and was transferred to hospital, from where he has since made a full recovery. A successful rescue involving multi agencies and some great teamwork.

The bus departs from Wedmore Car Park at The Lerburne at around 9.30 am to start picking up passengers. It returns to Wedmore between 1.30 pm and 3.30 pm depending on the destination. See below for more details.

The bus is a friendly place where there is normally a happy buzz of conversation. Our passengers often meet for a coffee whilst at the destination.

Anyone is welcome to come on the bus and a place can easily be booked by phone.

We try to pick up and drop off at the homes of all users who need this. For other passengers this will be at a location that is convenient for them. We are also flexible about drop offs on route.

We are happy to provide help in getting on and off the bus for those who need it.

Drivers are all volunteers who want to help passengers to enjoy their time on the bus as much as possible.

The service is free for everyone with a Concessionary Bus Pass and for children under 5 years old on all services except Cribbs Causeway. Cribbs Causeway is £2 for Concessions and free for children under 5. For other passengers, fares are low as the bus is financed by Somerset Council and drivers are volunteers.
